DEMONSTRATIONS OF DISUNITY ARE BAD FOR BUSINESS. AS PARTY CHAIRMAN I
TAKE FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CAMPAIGN - ITS GOOD POINTS AND ITS BACONES.

BUT LOYALTY HAS OFTEN BEEN CALLED OUR PARTY'S SECRET WEAPON. MY
MESSAGE TO MY COLLEAGUES IS TO DEMONSTRATE IT NOW.

THIS IS THE START OF A NEW CHAPTER FOR THE CONSERVATIVE PARTY

IN WALES. THERE IS MUCH TO DO. WE NEED TO RECRUIT MORE PROFESSIONAL

STAFF. WE MUST ENSURE THAT OUR CONSTITUENCY ASSOCIATIONS ARE STRONGER

AND MORE OUTWARD LOOKING. WE MUST ALL WORK TOGETHER WITH THE SECRETARY

OF STATE FOR WALES TO PUBLICISE THE GOOD NEWS ABOUT WHAT IS HAPPENING.

THE CAMPAIGN TO WIN THE GENERAL ELECTION IN WALES STARTS NOW.

MR CHAIRMAN, LET ME SAY ANOTHER WORD ABOUT THE EUROPEAN

ELECTIONS. I HAVE SAID QUITE CLEARLY THAT THE RESULTS WERE

DISAPPOINTING. THEY WILL DAMAGE BRITAIN BECAUSE THEY HAVE STRENGTHENED

SOCIALISM IN EUROPE.

THEY ARE A SET-BACK - BUT NOT A SURPRISE. AND THEY ARE NOT QUITE THAT RINGING VICTORY FOR LABOUR WHICH MR KINNOCK CLAIMS. IF WE

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REGARD THEM RIGHTLY THEY CAN BECOME A FURTHER STEP TOWARDS ENSURING TORY GOVERNMENT IN THE 1990s AND BEYOND.

NO: THEY WERE NOT A SURPRISE. IT IS NEVER A SURPRISE WHEN GOVERNMENTS : MID-TERM LOSE SUPPORT. JUST LOOK AT THE RESULTS ABROAD.

IN ALMOST EVERY EUROPEAN COUNTRY THE GOVERNING PARTIES LOST SEATS TO THEIR OPPONENTS AT THESE ELECTIONS.

REMEMBER 1981. THE ECONOMY LOOKED ROCKY. AND THE MEASURES TO PUT IT RIGHT, THOUGH TAKEN, HAD NOT YET WORKED. WE FELL IN THE OPINION POLLS TO MORE THAN 13 POINTS BEHIND THE LABOUR PARTY.

AND REMEMBER 1985. WE PUT INTEREST RATES UP TO TACKLE

16 PERCENTAGE POINTS BEHIND THE LABOUR PARTY.

AT THE GENERAL ELECTION WE CRUSHED THEM WITH A MAJORITY OF 101 SEATS.

I HAVE BEEN LOOKING THROUGH THE PRESS CUTTINGS. THEY REGORD
THE RES LTS OF THE EUROPEAN ELECTIONS. AND THEY MAKE PRETTY DISMAL
READING, I MUST ADMIT. THE SOBER PAGES OF THE FINANCIAL TIMES ARE
HEADLINED: 'LABOUR CLAIMS GAINS POINT WAY BACK TO NUMBER TEN'. THE
TELEGRAPH RECORDS: 'LABOUR GAINS IN EUROPE'. THE TIMES SAYS: 'LABOUR
FORCES THE TORIES INTO A STEADY RETREAT'. THE GUARDIAN SAYS: 'LABOUR
TAKES ITS EURO GAINS TO 15'.

BUT WAIT. 15 SEATS? NO: OF COURSE, I AM NOT TALKING ABOUT

THE 1989 EUROPEAN ELECTIONS BUT THE 1984 EUROPEAN ELECTIONS. FOR ALL

THE GLOOM AND DOOM IN 1984 AND ALL THAT LABOUR PARTY CROWING FROM ITS

NEW LOOK LABOUR LEADER - ONE NEIL GORDON KINNOCK - THEY WERE NOT ON

COURSE FOR NUMBER TEN BUT FOR ANOTHER THRASHING AT THE POLLS. AND THEY

WILL REPEAT THE EXPERIENCE.

I'M NOT SURPRISED THAT AT THESE ELECTIONS SOME OF OUR SUPPORTERS

STAYED AT HOME OR CAST THEIR VOTES IN PROTEST FOR ANOTHER PARTY.

INFLATION IS INDEED TOO HIGH. AND THE REMEDY - THE ONLY REMEDY - FOR

IT, WHICH IS HIGHER INTEREST RATES, IS NEVER PALATABLE OR PLEASANT.

AT LEAST IT'S CHEERED UP MR KINNOCK. HITHERTO HE'S SPECIALISED

/.. IN SERVING

IN TERVING FUDGE IN PLACE OF POLICY. NOW YOU'LL HAVE SEEN HE'S DOWNED HIS ISE-BREAM SALESMAN'S SUIT TO BASK IN THE MEDIA COMPLIMENTS HE PREFERS TO MEDIA QUESTIONS. HIS PRINCIPLE-FREE POLICIES, PRODUCED AND PACKAGED DOWN IN WALWORTH ROAD, HAVE SURVIVED A LITTLE LONGER. BUT WHEN MR KINNOCK CALLS THE RESULT A BOOST FOR LABOUR OR A REFERENDUM ON THE GOVERNMENT HE MUST BE JOKING.

THE GRAND SUM OF 14½ PER CENT OF THE ELECTORATE HAVE VOTED

FOR MR KINNOCK'S CANDIDATES AND 12½ PER CENT FOR OURS. MR KINNOCK'S

KNOWLEDGE OF THE CONSTITUTION MAY BE AS SHAKY AS HIS GRASP OF ECONOMICS.

BUT THE NEAREST THING IN BRITAIN TO A REFERENDUM OF OUR ACHIEVEMENTS

AND ON HIS LACK OF THEM, ON OUR LEADERSHIP AND HIS INCOMPETENCE, ON

OUR POLICIES AND HIS EVASIONS, WILL BE IN TWO OR THREE YEARS' TIME.

THE FACT IS THAT THERE WERE TWO PROTEST PARTIES IN THIS ELECTION

BOTH LABOUR AND THE GREENS CAREFULLY KEPT THEIR OWN EXTREMIST POLICIES OUT OF SIGHT AND UNDER WRAPS.

AND NOT ONLY DO THEY SHARE THE SAME ELECTORAL TACTICS: THEY SHARE A HOST OF CRAZY LEFT-WING POLICIES TOO. THE IRONY IS THAT LABOUR WOULD IMPLEMENT THEM FAR MORE EFFECTIVELY AND MORE DISASTROUSLY EVEN THAN THE GREENS.

THE GREENS JUST TALK OF STOPPING ECONOMIC GROWTH FOR EVER:

LABOUR'S POLICIES OF HIGH TAXES, HIGH SPENDING AND MORE TRADE UNION

POWER WOULD KILL IT.

THE GREENS JUST TALK OF PENALISING THE PRIVATE MOTORIST AND CLOSING DOWN NUCLEAR POWER: LABOUR HAVE ALREADY WORKED OUT THEIR BLUE-PRINT FOR SHARPLY HIGHER PETROL TAXES AND ENFORCED DEPENDENCE

ON MR SCARGILL'S COAL.

THE GREENS JUST TALK OF CURBS ON CONSUMERS' POWER TO CHOOSE:
LABOUR WOULD LEAVE THE CUSTOMER AT THE MERCY OF THE STATE-RUN
INDUSTRIES AND MILITANT UNION BOSSES.

THE GREENS JUST TALK OF BREAKING UP THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY:

LABOUR HAVE A SET OF POLICIES ON TRADE AND INDUSTRY WHICH COULD BE

ILLEGAL UNDER COMMUNITY LAW AND COULD LEAD A LABOUR BRITAIN TO BE BOOTED

OUT OF EUROPE ALTOGETHER.

THE GREENS JUST TALK OF DESTROYING NATO, THOUGH WITH HIGH

POLITICAL COURAGE THEY OMITTED TO DRAW ATTENTION TO IT DURING THE RECENT

ELECTIONS; LABOUR'S POLICIES OF UNDERMINING NATO'S STRATEGY AND

CRIPPLING OUR DETERRENT WOULD BRING IT ABOUT.

THE ONLY DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THEM IS THAT THE RANK AND FILE

OF THE GREEN PARTY ARE SOCIALIST EXTREMISTS: AND THE RANK AND FILE OF

STANDS, BUT NONE OF US KNOW WHERE MR KINNOCK STANDS - AND UNCERTAINTY

IS THE WORST POSSIBLE HANDMAIDEN OF DETERRENCE AND DEFENCE. THE SAD,

SAD THING IS THAT HIS AMBIGUITY IS NOT DETERMINED BY THE NOBLE IMPERATIVES

OF UK DEFENCE POLICY BUT BY THE SORDID NECESSITY TO BEMUSE A LABOUR PARTY

CONFERENCE.

AND LAST BUT NOT LEAST THERE IS A CHOICE OF LEADER.

MR KINNOCK CAN DISH OUT ABUSE - BUT HE CAN'T TAKE IT.

HE CAN QUESTION THE PRIME MINISTER'S PATRIOTISM - BUT HE CAN'T ANSWER QUESTIONS ABOUT HIS POLICIES.

HE CAN THROW HIS WEIGHT AROUND IN INDIAN RESTAURANTS AND
/.. AFRICAN AIRPORTS

AFRICAN AIRPORTS - BUT HE HASN'T THE GUTS TO STAND UP FOR BRITAIN.

HE'LL PLAY IN PUBLIC THE REPENTANT SINNER ON HIS DEFENCE POLICIES WHEN THAT SUITS - BUT HIS HYPOCRISY IS EVIDENT FROM THE FACT THAT HE WON'T LEAVE CND.

HE'S MORE WILLING TO TALK DOWN THE POUND - BUT HE HASN'T A CLUE
ABOUT BRINGING DOWN INFLATION. HIS MOST RECENT OFFERING IS NOT JUST
INADEQUATE BUT UNINTELLIGIBLE.

INDEED HE DOESN'T EVEN THINK HE <u>OUGHT</u> TO HAVE AN ANSWER.

QUESTIONED ABOUT MAJOR ECONOMIC ISSUES ON THE BBC MR KINNOCK HAS, IT SEEMS

TWO STOCK ANSWERS. TO MR DIMBLEBY HE REPLIED IN THESE IMMORTAL WORDS

(I QUOTE), 'WELL, EXACTLY. WELL, FINE. WELL, NOT AT ALL'.

TO MR NAUGHTIE HE EXPLODED THAT HE WOULD NOT GIVE (I QUOTE)

'A BLOODY WEA LECTURE'. I THINK THAT MY FATHER, WHO HIMSELF WORKED

SOME SIXTY YEARS AGO IN ADULT EDUCATION IN THE RHONNDA, MIGHT HAVE

EXPECTED SOMETHING BETTER FROM HIS DIMMEST PUPIL, AND I WONDER IF

MR KINNOCK CALLED THEM "BLOODY W.E.A. LECTURES" WHEN HE WAS A W.E.A.

LECTURER HIMSELF.

ABOVE ALL, MR KINNOCK IS STILL A LEFT-WING SOCIALIST. STILL A PRISONER OF THE UNIONS WHOSE POWER AND PRIVILEGES HE WOULD RESTORE. -E
WAS RAISED IN THE LABOUR PARTY. HE HAS NEVER WORKED OUTSIDE THE LABOUR

We spoke yesterday about the Prime Minister's visit to Central Office tomorrow, Wednesday.

As you are aware, having embarked on the modernisation of 32 Smith Square, we no longer have the space available to accommodate everyone into one complete gathering.

If the Prime Minister is content, the Chairman proposes to hold two short, but similar, meetings at 2.00 p.m. and 2.20 p.m. respectively. The first would be held in the large open area on the first floor(next to the office in which we held the European Press Conference briefings) to encompass staff on the ground, first and second floors and the latter, in the Press Office area on the third floor, for staff on the third, fourth and fifth floors.

We will provide coffee so that the Prime Minister could say a few words and then mix briefly with staff as time allows. With the public transport difficulties I don't envisage either gathering being restrictively overcrowded.

The Prime Minister would then be free to leave Central Office at 2.40 p.m.

I realise that this will involve the Prime Minister in doing two more or less identical meetings but under the circumstances it seems the best alternative. Could you let me know if this is satisfactory?
